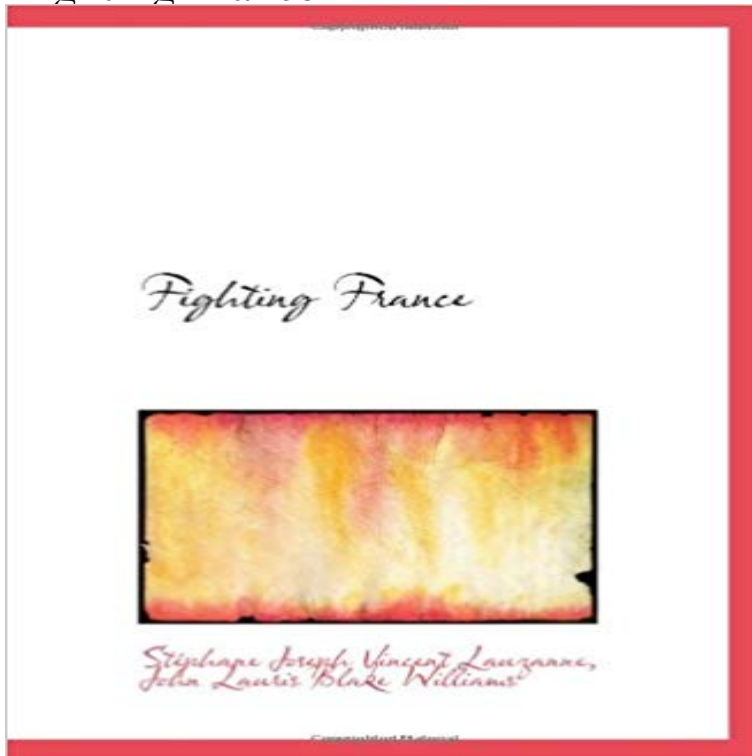


Fighting France
