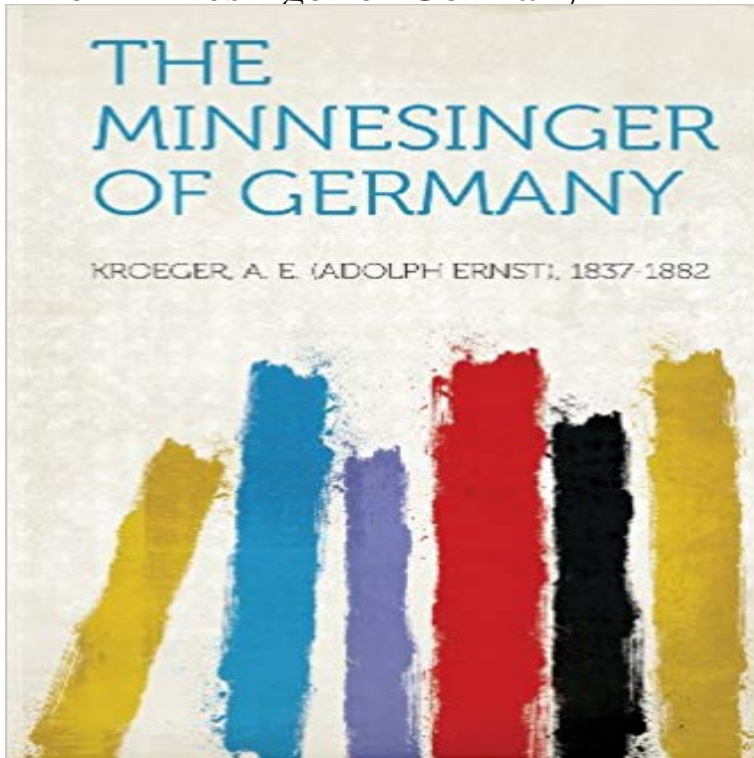


The Minnesinger of Germany
