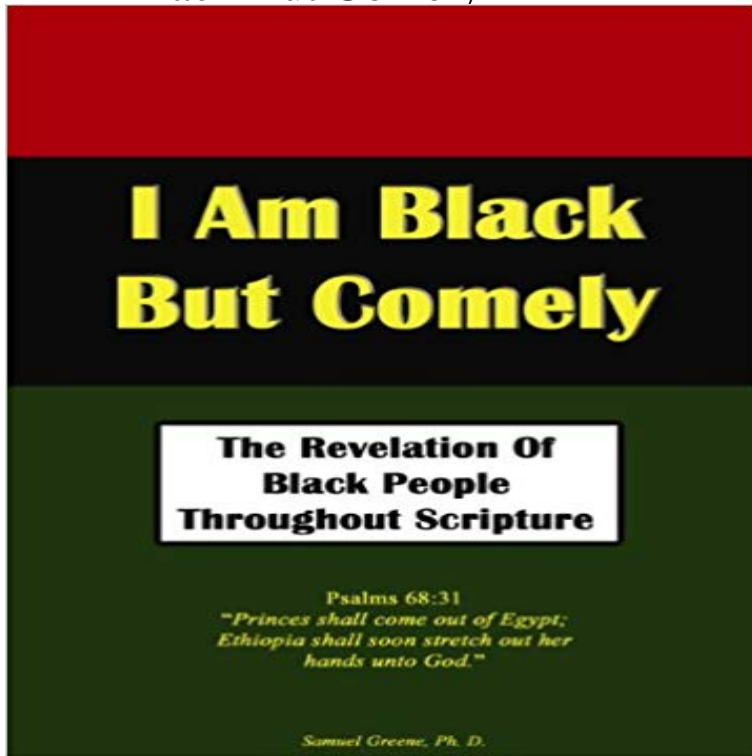


I Am Black But Comely
