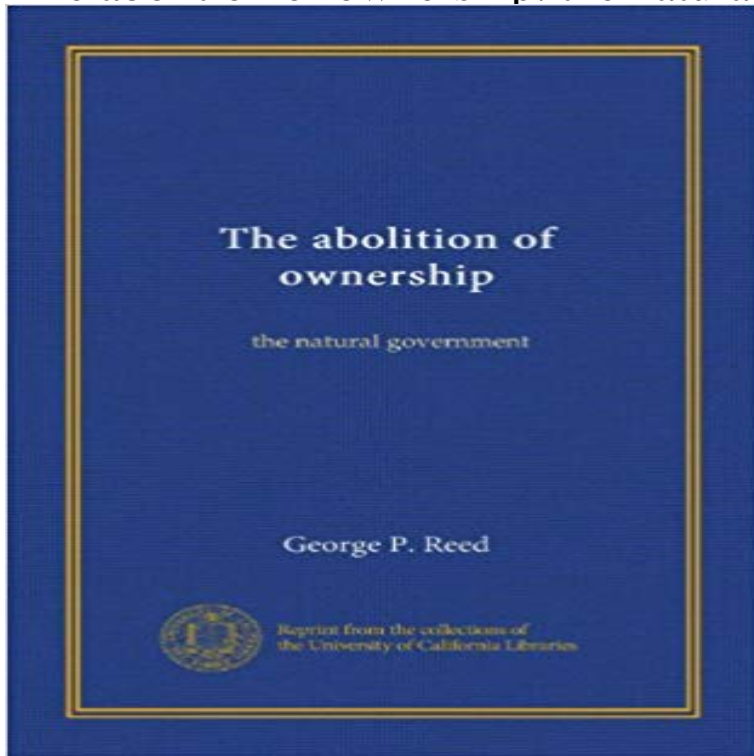


# The abolition of ownership: the natural government
