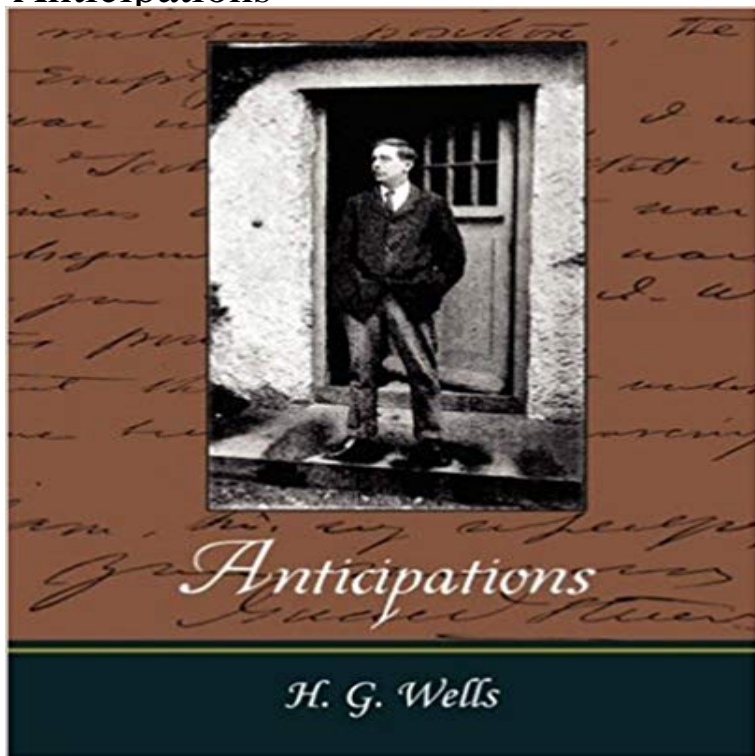


Anticipations
