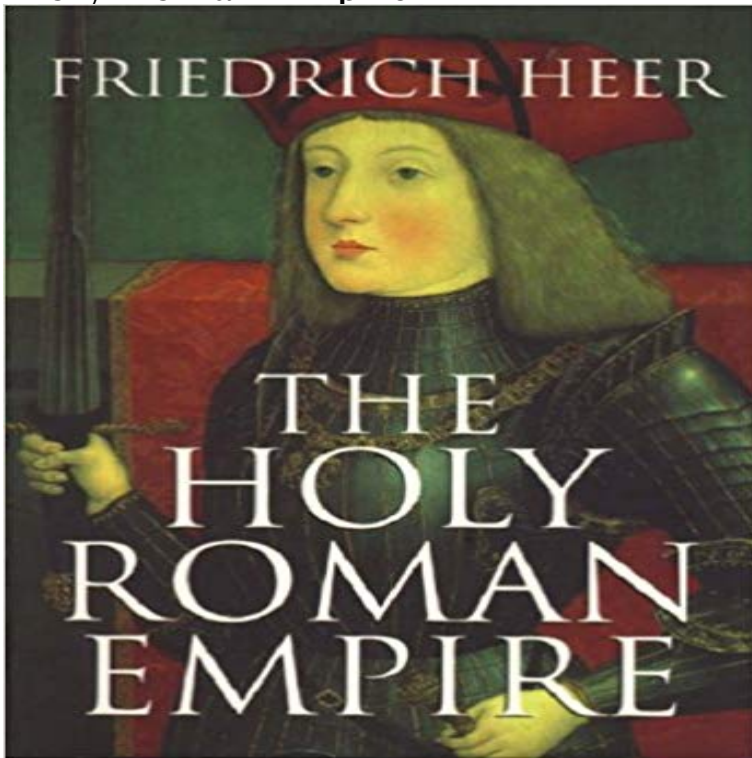


Holy Roman Empire
