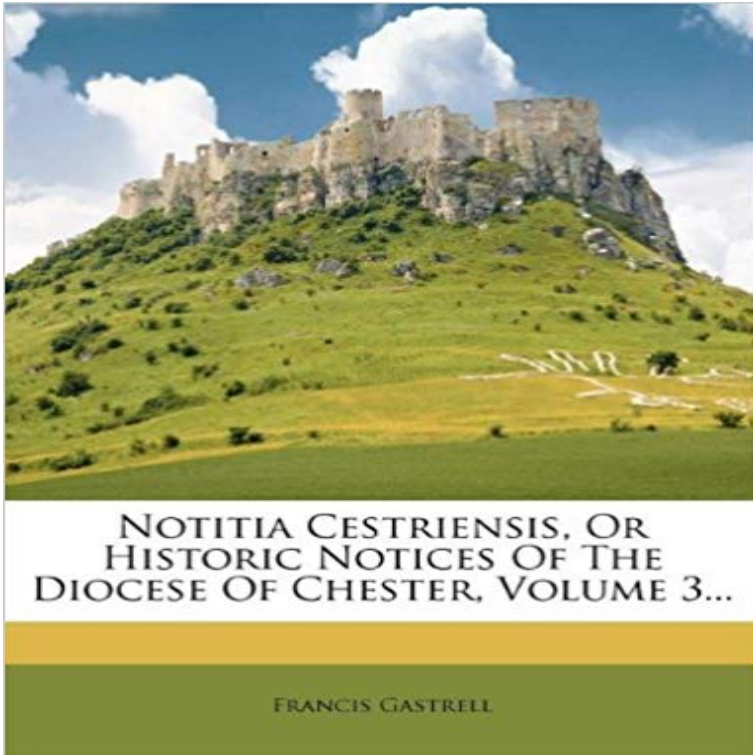


# Notitia Cestriensis, Or Historic Notices Of The Diocese Of Chester, Volume 3...
