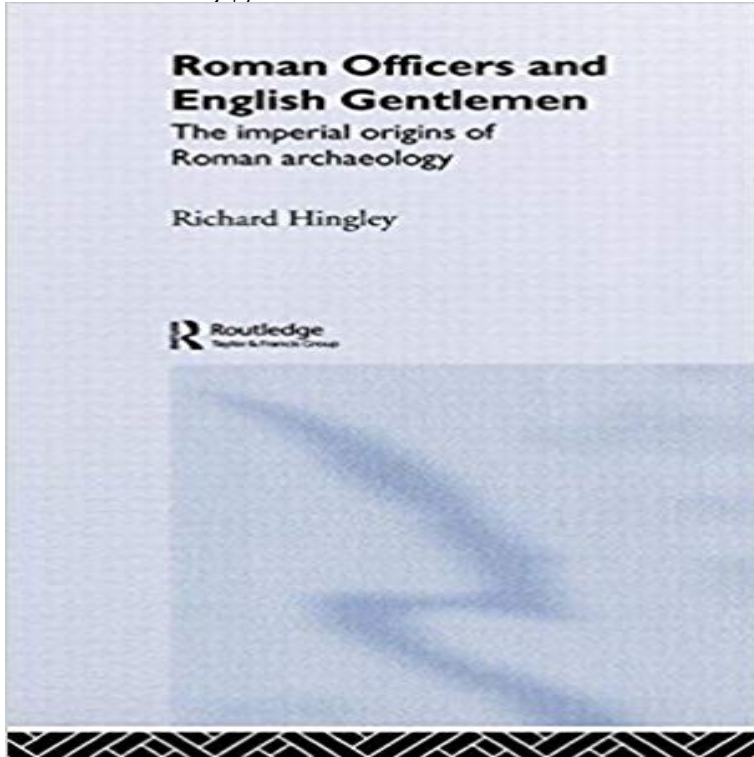


Roman Officers and English Gentlemen: The Imperial Origins of Roman Archaeology
