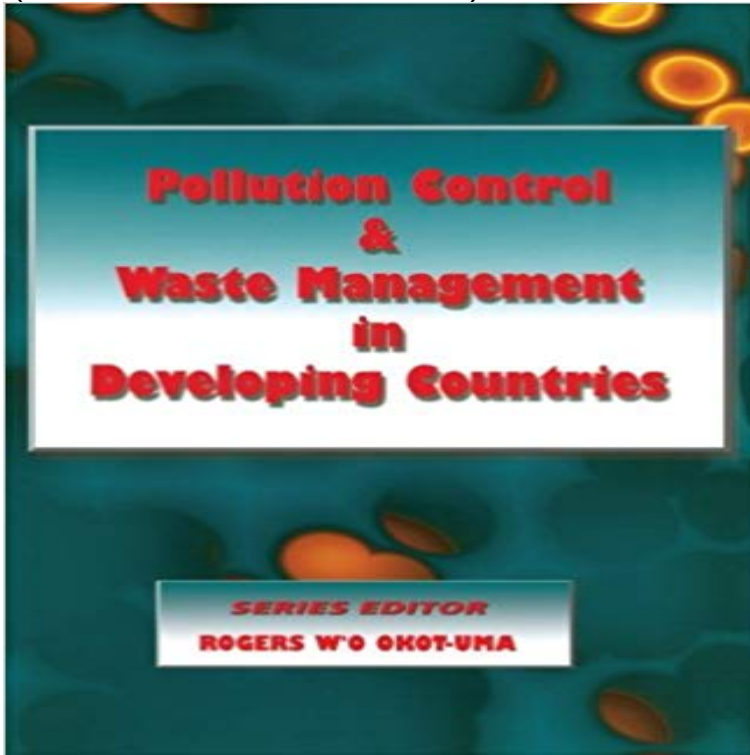


Pollution Control and Waste Management in Developing Countries (Environmental Studies)
