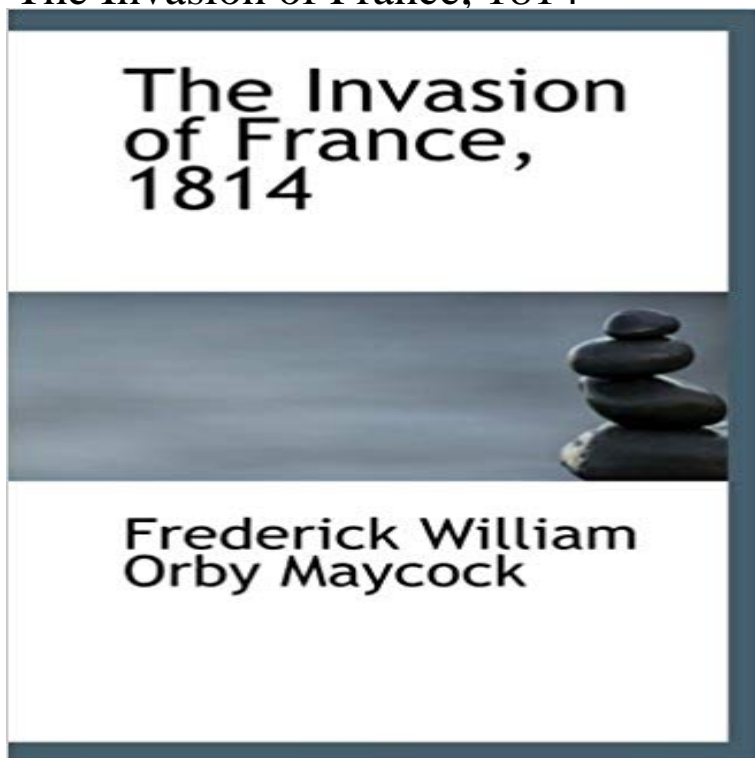


The Invasion of France, 1814
