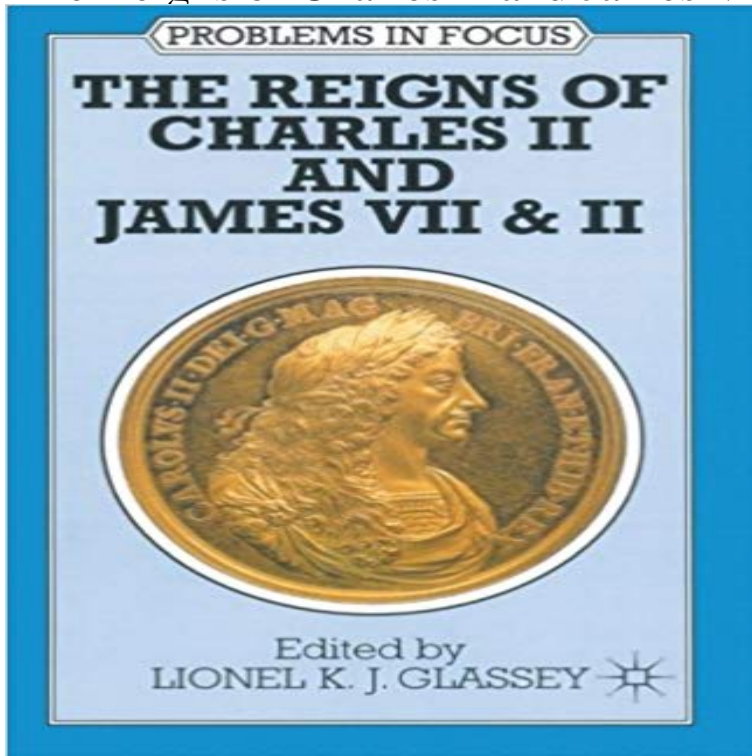


## The Reigns of Charles II and James VII & II (Problems in Focus S)
